Angling Society

The Angling Society's contact with it's membership is threefold.

Firstly, there is a web site open to all, which has had an 'in house' rebuild by one of the Society's own members and allows for a member's forum, direct links to

HASSRA and other bodies such as the Angling Trust etc.

Partly because of the web site rebuild and also the wish for members to interrelate and to be speedily kept informed and up to date, a Facebook page was launched.

The Facebook page is an ideal avenue to publish our newsletter - 'Anglers'. It brings together news, personal articles, snippets of the Society's history, and plenty of humour. 'Anglers' is the highly recommended and popular read, produced monthly in a clear ad identifiable style with an attractive layout including photographs and cartoons.

Fylde Flyer (Runner Up)

Fylde Flyer is produced quarterly and distributed to Fylde members, via email, with a copy placed on the Intranet site and another placed amongst the files in the Facebook Group with a link on the twitter feed.

As the Fylde Flyer is distributed to most members at work, the battle is to make it something staff want to take the time to peruse during their own time. Based on the positive feedback received, the number of staff that enter the competition and the number who have attended events after seeing it advertised in

the Newsletter has shown it was a wise and popular decision to relaunch a Regional communication.

Norcross Cricket Club (WINNER)

The club keep its members updated through e-mail, e.g., to parents about net sessions, outdoor practise, matches, selection and so on. In addition, there are social media sites: Facebook, TeamApp, WhatsApp, Twitter and Instagram. The Club's social media activity has recently won an award.

The Presentation Night Programme is made available to members on the night of our presentation, but also electronically via social media and e-mail. It contains summaries of the season for all of the teams, Senior and Junior, as well as all the stats – just like a Norcross CC mini-Wisden!

Rambling Club (Runner Up)

The Newsletter is produced every single month and all members receive their own copy. This is mainly by email, but some hard copies are posted out. These are produced by volunteers.

Every month the Newsletter contains details from the walk leaders of the next month's walks and reports on the previous month's walks. There is also information about other ongoing events such as any charity events or day trips or weekends away. Individuals share any celebrations or we update the news about anyone not well.

The Newsletter is always colourful, with plenty of photos, usually of members on walks, in our beautiful British countryside. There are often photos taken at celebrations, such as Christmas, or the club annual weekend away.

He also competed for the National HASSRA Team at the CSSC National Swimming Championships winning 5 medals at different strokes.

He has also had a hugely successful time in his other passion of Triathlons. Taking part in races across the region and with regularity winning his age group and often achieving podium finishes in the open ages. His most important event was the Southport Sprint Triathlon, this was a European Qualifiers Event. Angling Society

The Angling Society provides high quality fishing facilities at several venues, with Franks Pool being the “Jewel in the Crown”.

The Society has a good relationship with the Environmental Agency, and Fishing Officers removed an abundance of small fish was removed to give to other clubs whose waters had been heavily polluted, due to the quality of the Society’s waters.

During the summer preventative actions by the Society officers and members meant that Frank’s Pool was one of only a few major waters that escaped a virus that had devastated other fishing sites across Lancashire. This could not have happened with co-operation from all. Restrictions meant the usual competitions could not take place but the Society did hold other events later in the year, which were very well attended.

The Society membership is in good shape, and has come together throughout the year, forming work parties to erect safe fishing platforms, trim back trees and bushes and remove underwater obstructions to improve facilities.

Aside from fishing there has been a Hot Pot Evening and a slide show and talk from a well known and respected angling author.

The Society has its own Facebook group and uses this, along with a newsletter to communicate with members.

2017 was an impressive year for the Society and it is well placed to continue to move forward.

Fylde Golf Society

In 2017 there were 35 active golfers within the Society. All of whom played at least one event. The Society has been working hard over the last few years to encourage golfers of all abilities to join them and this is evidenced by the fact that we have some members who are single figure handicappers and a number who

are relatively new to the game with handicaps up to the maximum of 28 (36 for the female members of the Society). Throughout the year we rotate the groupings so that everyone gets to play with as many different members as possible. Whilst the events are all competitive with small prizes and Trophies being awarded, the main aim is to encourage the members to get out and play golf at courses that they might not otherwise get the chance to play. With a typical golf course being in the region of 6000 yards, it also contributes to the general wellbeing and health of our members.

Give Nature a Home (Runner Up)

The Club provides members with an outlet to learn about their local habitat and to encourage participation in nature conservation activities for all abilities. Activities include sighting and on-going maintenance of nesting boxes, feeder stations. Its original aspiration was to encourage Wildlife to return to Peel Park and make it their home in safe environment in support of the RSPB "Give Nature a Home" national campaign. It is open to all staff within Peel Park and surrounding areas.

The Club also work closely with the Site Maintenance Company and team, who have added their support and encouragement for the group, helping with clearing areas and advice. It is through this group that we contribute to the National Pollinator Strategy creating a corridor through the country for wildlife and insects including bees. One of the nest boxes provided shelter for a group of Tree Bees over the summer.

A couple of more "knowledgeable" members have lead guided walks around the site to introduce members to what's about and help spot the different birds and rare plants such as wild orchids. These events have been open for all staff at Peel Park. Sightings included: 2 Kestrels nesting, Chiff Chaffs, Thrush, Sedge Warblers, White Throats, Black Caps, Gold Finches and a pair of extremely rare Grey Partridge.

Norcross Cricket Club (WINNER)

Voted best amateur cricket club in an Internet Poll. The Club also came top out of all the Palace Shield clubs for social media and online engagement. They signed up to ECB All-Stars – and ran sessions on Thursday nights before junior nets and several



young players represented Wyre District age groups with one player in the Palace Shield U21 Rep Side that played the MCC.

Fundraising and sponsorship allowed the club to offer playing and training shirts for seniors and juniors, improving the image, identity and 'professionalism' of the club. The club coordinated the refurbishment of the patio area and installation of the HASSRA grounds signage. They successfully hosted three heats of the Wyre Schools Kwik Cricket competitions.

The Club's strength is their inclusivity and desire to facilitate cricket for players of all abilities and ages. The club offers coaching by qualified coaches in a safe and fun environment, with participation at the heart of what they do

Rambling Club

This year the Club celebrated its 25th anniversary with a party night. Lots of mementos and old photos with 45 members and previous members enjoying a fun quiz, a free raffle and hot pot and apple pie supper.

We have held a long weekend each year for 23 years and this year took 37 members to Llandudno, in Wales with, 6 different walks offered and enjoyed.

It was a very enjoyable social weekend.

After the December Sunday walk, there was a meal and free raffle, when everyone won a small prize. The Monday group also did the same with a meal out after their walk.

The Tuesday night Summer walks also follow suit and on the last night enjoyed pizza, salad and chips.

Two of the walk leaders successfully completed the Country Walking 2017 challenge of walking 1000 miles and proudly wore their medals at the Christmas meal.

Members took part in many charity events including the Blackpool 10K Fun Run, 45 miles bike ride, 8 miles midnight Illumathon walk and the club's own Illuminations walk, and the Santa Dash - all for Trinity Hospice the club's chosen charity for 2017. In total club members have raised over £1,000.00 for charity in 2017.
